# WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS UPDATE?

This document tells you how the fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. The Trustees of the Maritime Retirement Scheme prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013.

# **DESCRIPTION OF THIS FUND**

Invests about 80% in bonds and cash with about 20% in shares and other growth assets. Suited to shorter-term investors who want fairly consistent returns with less ups and downs than can be expected from the Balanced Portfolio.

# WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF INVESTING?



The risk indicator for the Conservative Fund is 4. The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Note that even the lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment, and there are other risks that are not captured by this rating.



Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

#### **EXAMPLE OF HOW THIS APPLIES TO AN INVESTOR**

Brian had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Brian received a return after fund charges were deducted of 873 (that is 8.73% of his initial \$10,000. No other charges were deducted. This gives Brian a total return after tax of \$739 for the year.
